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ASSET CONSULTING GROUP - FINANCIAL CONSULTANT REPORT FOR MONTH ENDED MAY 31, 2025 AND DISCUSSION ON REBALANCING PORTFOLIO ASSETS AMONG VARIOUS ASSET STRATEGIES AND MANAGERS. BOARD TO TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION AS DEEMED NECESSARY.

Mr. Jason Pulos reviewed the ASAP report for the month ended May 31, 2025, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit "F". As of May 31, 2025, the total fund was approximately \$3,363,673,000.00. The one-year return net of fees for the total fund is 7.70%.

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<u>DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE VOTE ON REVISIONS TO THE OKLAHOMA POLICE PENSION AND RETIREMENT SYSTEM DISABILITY POLICY ADOPTED FEBRUARY 1, 2025. BOARD TO TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION AS DEEMED NECESSARY.</u>

The board discussed the OPPRS Disability Policy that was effective 2/1/2025. The fowling process was outlined for the application process.

STEPS FOR APPLYING FOR A DISABILITY BENEFIT

- 1. Request and receive an application for a Disability Benefit. Attached to the application will be a list of required documentation that you must provide to the System.
- 2. Receive a copy of the OPPRS Disability Policy. If the disability is a PTSD disability, 6 months of Mental Health Counselling is required before the disability can be approved. The board may be petitioned and allow for an exemption from this treatment requirement in extreme cases. Anyone wishing to petition for an exemption from the 6-month requirement must do so in writing.
- 3. Return the completed application and all required documents to OPPRS for processing. You may include any additional documents that might be pertinent.
- 4. As part of your diagnosis, your mental health professional should clearly state that you have reached Maximum Medical Improvement and can no longer perform the duties of a police officer.
- 5. Once your application is complete and has been reviewed by the System's doctor it will be placed on the next available monthly agenda for consideration and review by the board.
- 6. If the application is set for a board meeting agenda prior to 6-months of mental health counseling being completed, the board has the authority to either approve the application in full or deny the exemption to the 6-month requirement.
- 7. If the board denies the exemption to the 6-month requirement, the applicant can continue to receive treatment until the 6-month requirement is completed. Once the 6-month requirement has been met, any new records from your counselor that were not included with the original application should be provided to OPPRS to be reviewed again by the System's doctor. Once the System's doctor completes this review your disability application will be added to the next available monthly agenda for board consideration.

The bord also formed a Legislative Committee to look at options for improving the statutory disability language. The committee will be Mark Mason, John Weber, and Bo DeBose.

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DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Ms. Sigler stated that everything was going well in the office. She noted that Crawford and Associates finished up the Internal Audit and everything went well. She stated SB462 was passed and signed, which gave cities the option to give retirees their municipal-issued badges and firearms. She advised that the RFPs for International All Cap received 59 responses, Private Credit received about 35 responses and the Investment Consultants wasn't due until 6/30/25.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mr. Stephen Smith addressed the board and stated the following;

I'd just like to reiterate what you guys are talking about, about the PTSD issues with the coalition. You know, I've had a lot of complaints, or concerns, not complaints, that have come down about that. I, pull this up here, I had a note section here that I was going to address.

You've addressed a lot of those already. My wife is in a mental health field. It's a real deal.

PTSD is real. On that note, I will say this, and I think those of you that are officers here will probably agree that there's not one of us in here that doesn't have a certain degree of it. I've seen heads lopped off, shot off, arms missing, kids, you name it.

We've all seen it. I'm not special. We've all been there, done that, okay? I do believe that there's a certain amount of probably vetting on the city's part on hiring people.

They need to probably explore a little bit deeper into the mental health aspect of people that they're hiring. And I think that that's something that probably needs to be addressed. Because if we're hiring people that are not mentally capable, we test them physically, but mentally, I don't know that we're going in depth enough in order to be able to make sure that they're capable of doing the jobs.

I see a concern with, like the medical marijuana issues that we've had, rubber stamp doctors. I can see that becoming an issue at some point if this continues on the road that it's on. Another issue that I see is recruiting.

I've seen a recruiting poster from Oklahoma City that specifically highlights PTSD in the middle of the recruiting poster. I don't know that we need to be using that as a recruiting tool. I could foresee an issue with, and I don't know how many years you have to do in order to be able to get PTSD, but I'm going to spit this out and just say you do a year.

Let's say you have someone that they're qualified to be a police officer, but they have an ulterior motive to I'm going to hire on, I'm going to do a year, and I'm going to get a PTSD retirement after a year and go on to do another career, kind of like what you were just talking about, Mark. And now they get a 20-year retirement out of our pension system, and then they get to go do a full other career as a result of that. So, I do think the law needs to be tightened up, and anything that you guys can do to help that would be fantastic.

I think that this pension system is for the people that truly need it. It's for the officers that did their time. It's for the people that can no longer do any more time legitimately.

And I think the big concern is abuse of the system, and we definitely need to put a clamp down on that. So I thank you guys for talking about that, and I think that's heading down the right path. Thank you.

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The meeting was adjourned at approximately 11:09 a.m.
